Assemblymember Rodriguez Presents State Budget Allocation Check at the Chino Valley Chamber of Commerce

A total of \$1 million has been allocated to aid the Chino Valley Chamber of Commerce in establishing the new Upskill Chino Valley program. This program will focus on further developing entrepreneurship, the workforce, the economy, and leadership throughout the city.
